BASIC LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING



Is this program for you?

Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) is designed to give students essential skills required for entry-level employment as law enforcement officers with state, county, or municipal governments, or with private enterprise.

What will your life be like as a Basic Law Enforcement Training student? This program utilizes state commission-mandated topics and methods of instruction. General subjects include, but are not limited to, criminal, juvenile, civil, traffic, and alcoholic beverage laws; investigative, patrol, custody, and court procedures; emergency responses; and ethics and community relations.

What are your potential opportunities with Basic Law Enforcement Training?

This program is for adults desiring a career in law enforcement. Individuals seeking careers in the police or sheriff's departments, traffic enforcement, K-9 unit, DARE program, or detention areas must complete this 624-hour program.

How do you get started?

BLET has special admissions requirements. Students seeking admission to this program must:

- ✓ be a U.S. citizen of good moral character.
- ✓ be at least 20 years of age.
- ✓ be a high school graduate or equivalent. (Correspondence diplomas are not accepted.)
- ✓ make a satisfactory placement score on assessment testing.
- ✓ have or have the ability to obtain a valid North Carolina driver's license.
- ✓ not have any felony or serious misdemeanor convictions.
- ✓ pass criminal history and background checks.

Contact BLET Director Lindsay Walton well in advance, as the admissions process takes four to six weeks. The BLET Director provides all state-approved forms. Space is limited to 24 students and is offered two times per year.

BCC students may request a tuition waiver from local law enforcement agencies. Cost of uniforms, texts, and other fees apply.
