Concurrent Enrollment allows eligible students to enroll in high school courses and community college courses simultaneously, TUITION FREE!

For most courses, students receive high school regular credit or honors credit and college credit.

Enjoy earning college credit early, with a huge cost savings. Popular courses among Concurrently Enrolled students: cosmetology, English, medical terminology, psychology, sociology, and welding. Students are allowed to take as many credit hours as they can handle.

What are your potential opportunities with Concurrent Enrollment? Brunswick Community College can enable you to begin earning your Bachelor's degree, Associate's degree, diploma, or certificate in the field of your choice while you are still in high school. Remain at BCC after high school graduation to complete your degree and transfer your credits to a four-year college or university.

How do you get started?

Admission guidelines for Concurrent Enrollment are as follows:

- ⇒ High school students must be at least 16 years old.
- ⇒ Students must be successfully taking at least two high school credits.
- ⇒ Students must place into the desired courses based on placement assessment.
- ⇒ Students must receive written permission from their parent(s) and high school.
- ⇒ Community college courses cannot displace any high school course.
- ⇒ Students cannot take developmental courses.
- ⇒ Students must purchase their own textbooks and course equipment when applicable.

After the guidelines have been met, there are a series of steps to become concurrently enrolled.

- ⇒ First, discuss with your parent(s) and high school counselor which courses to take.
- ⇒ Take the COMPASS placement assessment or SAT.
- ⇒ Turn in a completed application and authorization form.
- ⇒ Complete your course planning form. Register for classes.
- ⇒ Pay fees, purchase textbooks, obtain a parking decal, and have a student ID made.
- ⇒ You are now a BCC student!

Credits Earned

High school and college credits are awarded to high school students upon completion of curriculum courses. Honors credits will be given for all College Transfer courses.
